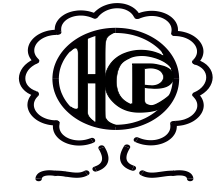

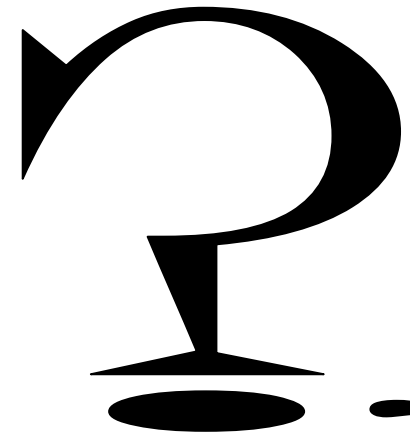

## Moving to Year Three

Frequently Asked  
Questions



Moving into Key Stage Two can seem daunting for some. By now your child will have spent some time with their new Year Three teacher and feel more prepared for September. Here are some frequently asked questions and answers that should help to make the transition even smoother.

### **How does my child enter the Junior playground?**

All the Key Stage Two children enter the playground by following the path that leads around the side of Haxby Playgroup.

### **When does the school day end?**

In Key Stage Two the school day finishes slightly later at 3:30pm.

### **Where will my child put their things?**

Each child has their own locker and some classes also have trays for children to put their things in within the classroom.

### **How are reading books organised?**

Your child's Key Stage One teacher will have passed information up regarding the book band colour your child will need to read in September. Home readers are stored centrally in the library and children will be given the opportunity to change these if required once a week as part of the school day.

### **Is a snack still provided at break times?**

Snacks will no longer be provided by school. Therefore, if you would like your child to have a snack for morning break, please send them with a healthy option. Children will not need a snack for afternoon break time and all snacks should be provided in addition to any packed lunches. All children should bring in a full water bottle; there will be opportunities for children to refill these throughout the day.

### **Is my child still entitled to a free meal?**

Universal Free School Meals are for children in Reception and Key Stage One only. However, if you are in receipt of certain benefits, you may still be entitled to claim free meals in Key Stage Two. Please email the school office for the relevant form. For those wishing to continue having a school lunch, please use our booking and payment system on School Money.

### **Will my child be taught by anyone else?**

Children will be taught by other staff to cover weekly planning and assessment time for teachers. Additionally, classes in Key Stage Two are streamed for maths on a daily basis and spelling once a week so it is possible that your child will have a different teacher for these subjects.

### **Should my child bring their own pencil case?**

School will provide all stationery items your child will need. However, your child may bring a small pencil case to school should they wish.

### **Are there any changes to PE kits?**

Children are encouraged to wear trainers in Key Stage Two for outdoor sessions. Kits should be plain and not be branded with sports logos; they should be clearly named. Where necessary a hair band/bobble should be sent with your child and jewellery will need to be removed.

### **What homework will my child be expected to complete?**

Children are expected to complete fortnightly maths tasks. In addition, they may have a weekly online spelling list to practise. Children are expected to read aloud at home three times a week. Once a year, children are given a half-term homework project.

### **Can I do anything else to help?**

Children are expected to take far more responsibility in KS2 for their own learning, time management and organization. Tasks such as packing their own bags and writing reminders in planners should be encouraged at home to promote independence.

### **Will I get to meet my child's new teacher before they start school in September?**

If you wish, there will be an opportunity to informally meet your child's new teacher during our 'meet your teacher' drop in session after school on Wednesday 10th July.
