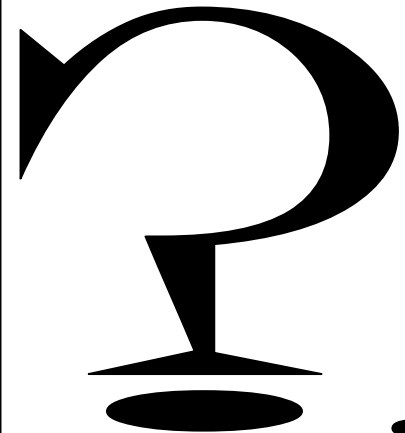

Moving to Year 5

*Frequently Asked
Questions*



Moving into Year 5 can sometimes seem like a challenge for parents and children. By now, your child will have spent some time with their new Year Five teacher and feel more prepared for September. Here are some frequently asked questions and answers that should help to make the transition even smoother.

What homework will my child be expected to complete?

Children will have weekly spelling homework and are expected to read aloud at least three times a week to an adult and have their planner signed to show this.

Maths is completed weekly, alternating between MyMaths online homework and a page in their maths homework book (like the ones in Year 3/4).

There will be two homework projects through the year, which will take the place of regular literacy homework.

Where will my child put their things?

Just like in Year 3/4, each child has their own locker for bags, coats and P.E. kits.

Some classes may also have trays for children to put their things in within the classroom.

How are reading books organised?

Your child's Year 3/4 teacher will have passed up information regarding the book band colour your child will need to read in September.

Children will be given the opportunity to return and change their library books once a week at the main school library.

Will my child be taught by anyone else?

Children will at times be taught by other staff to cover planning and assessment time for teachers (PPA).

Additionally, children in Year 5/6 will be taught in numeracy groups on a daily basis so it is possible that your child will have a different teacher and classroom for this subject. Mrs Bonsey will teach 5/6 Green on Fridays.

Should my child bring their own pencil case?

Children are allowed to bring in their own pencil case.

School will provide all stationery needed in the first week.

Are there any changes to PE kits?

In Year 5/6, children are expected to have their PE kits in school everyday. Children are encouraged to wear trainers for outdoor PE sessions. Please make sure your child can tie their shoelaces. All kits should still be clearly named and, where necessary, hair bands should be provided from home. Kits should not be branded with sports logos and jewellery will need to be removed prior to the lesson.

Can I do anything else to help?

Children are expected to take far more responsibility in Year 5/6 for their own learning, time management and self-organisation.

Tasks such as packing their own school bags should be encouraged at home to promote independence. Please also support them to plan their time effectively so homework tasks are completed within the deadline set.
