Pupil Premium Strategy 2021-2022

This premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers.

Allocations for the academic year 2021 to 2022 were calculated using the January 2021 school census data of the number of pupils in Reception to Year 6, who were registered as eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years. The current level of funding is £1,345.00 per pupil in Reception to Year 6, £2,345.00 for children in receipt of Pupil Premium Plus, and £310.00 for each service child.

- As part of the schools COVID-19 'recovery plan', an additional teacher will be assigned to Year 5/6 in the mornings and Years 3/4 in the afternoon to provide additional teaching and learning provision.
- A designated mentor will support an individual pupil and family.
- Specific resources linked to physical needs of pupils.
- Opportunities for financial support to ensure inclusion of children in widening learning opportunities.
- Teaching support with a focus on gaps in learning

How we will measure the impact of the pupil premium

- Regular interaction between School, pupils and families.
- Pupil's progress and attainment is monitored by teachers, phase leaders and Pupil Premium Champion at three main data collection points throughout the year and identified actions implemented.
- Review of spending and impact undertaken in April 2022.
