

Pupil Premium Strategy 2017-2018

This premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers.

Allocations for the academic year 2017 to 2018 were calculated using the January 2017 school census data of the number of pupils in Reception to Year 6, who were registered as eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years. The current level of funding is £1,320.00 per pupil in Reception to Year 6 and one child is in receipt of Pupil Premium Plus.

Headlands Primary School received a total of £17,640.00

Money carried forward from previous year= £3,099

Total allocation= £20,739.00

Summary of the main barriers to educational achievement faced by eligible pupils

- Home/ School support

- Opportunities for financial support to ensure inclusion of children in widening learning opportunities.
- Bespoke EAL teaching support
- Teaching support with a focus on gaps in learning

How we will measure the impact of the pupil premium

- Regular interaction between School, pupils and families.
- Pupil's progress and attainment is monitored by teachers, phase leaders and Pupil Premium Champion at three main data collection points throughout the year and identified actions implemented.
- Review of spending strategy and impact undertaken in July 2018.
