A huge thank you for supporting our 'Wear something blue' on Friday in memory of Elsie and participating in our 'Wave of light'.

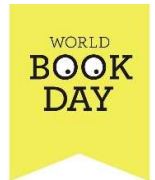
Thank you also for your generous donations for Candlelighters and Oscar's. We will let you know the final amount raised by Headlands families in due course as more contributions are being handed in.

Mother's or 'special people in our lives' Day: PTA event in school on Friday 13th March

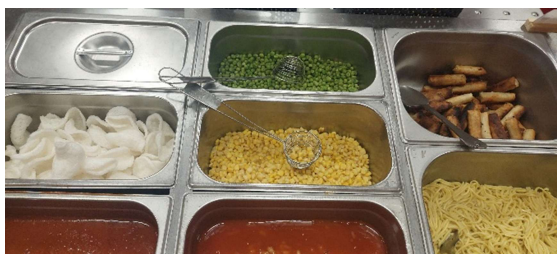
