Attendance



Good attendance is extremely important to enable your child to learn and achieve. Being in school every day allows consistency in their learning and helps them develop confidence and friendships.

Encouraging and promoting good attendance is important for your child's wellbeing as well as academic development.

The school's overall attendance figure from September 2022 to February half term was 96.01% which is above the National figure of 94% for State funded Primary Schools. At Parents Evenings we will share and celebrate your child's attendance.

Please have **contingency plans** in place for your child if we need to close their class.

Staffing levels may also impact our Parents evening appointments, and so we would also inform you via text by 9.30am if this was cancelled.


