School Census Day: Reception and Key Stage One School Dinners



All children in Reception and Year1/2 classes are entitled to a free school meal but not everyone takes up this offer. In order for the school to pay for this service we receive funding for next year from the Government based on the number of Reception and Year1/2 children who have a school dinner on **Thursday 5th October**, School Census day. If a child does not have a hot dinner on this day but then takes the free meal for the rest of the year, school receives no funding for this.

Census day is when the Local Authorities collect information electronically from every school in their area, partly to guide them in planning and funding. They collect details such as pupil numbers, numbers of pupils with Special Educational Needs, entitled to Pupil Premium funding, entitled to Free School Meals, attendance information and so forth. One thing in particular they are looking at this term is the number of children taking the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM), to provide schools with appropriate funding for this service for the next year.

Please would you consider sending your child for a hot dinner this Thursday. The School Office will order a hot meal for all Reception and Year 1/2 children on that day, but you can still send in a packed lunch with your child, although they could maybe try a little of the school lunch too. Hopefully it will also create some enthusiasm amongst the children who don't normally take the meals and lead to more of them eating over the rest of the school year. You can order yourself for your child using the School Money System, if you prefer.

The Menu for Thursday 5th October is:

- Fish Fingers with Chips or Puff Pastry Cheese Pinwheel with Chips
- Seasonal Vegetables

• Pudding is 'Celebration Census Cake', or Fresh Fruit Pot, yoghurt or piece of fruit.


• If your child does not like the main meal, there is a Jacket Potato alternative with Tuna, Cheese or Beans or a Ham Sandwich.

• There is also a salad bar with a wide range of choices such as cucumber, grapes, raisons, mange tout, tomatoes, blueberries, orange, honey dew and water melon and fresh French bread daily.

REST GO SLOW STOP

At Headlands we use the 'Zones of regulation' as a framework for teaching and practicing the skills of selfregulation to develop children's independence to control their behaviour. This allows a consistent approach across the school as we have a common language with which to discuss emotions and how to regulate feelings.

Within the 'Zones of regulation' there is a progression of skills and vocabulary as the children move up through school.

The framework helps children identify emotions, triggers and develop problem solving skills to manage emotions. It

is based on four colours to support self-regulation and emotional control. From time to time we all come across circumstances when we are less regulated. This provides a useful toolkit for helping support our mental health in school.
